2019 Scholarship Application Deadline: April 6, 2019

In support of Wisconsin's Money Smart Week (March 30-April 06, 2019), the Money Smart Week Southwest Wisconsin Committee and its partner organizations are sponsoring the Money Smart 2019 Scholarship Contest. Graduating high school seniors are encouraged to answer this year's Money Smart Question (see below) with an essay of up to 500 words. Three students will be named this year's Money Smart Scholarship winners and receive a \$1,000 Edvest gift card.

THE 2019 QUESTION IS:

In 2018, the average debt for a Wisconsin student graduating with a bachelor's degree was approximately \$30,000. About two-thirds of students take out loans.

- Estimate the total cost of your education (room, board, tuition, etc.) and explain how you plan to pay for it.
- Discuss how the cost of your schooling compares to the potential salary you may earn in your chosen field.
- Realizing that you will likely have some degree of debt when you graduate, how do you plan to keep it at a minimum?

GUIDELINES

Candidates Must:

- Be a graduating high school senior.
- Have knowledge of money management skills (decision making related to spending and saving, investing, use of credit, etc.) appropriate for their age and grade level.
- Live in one of the following

Wisconsin counties: Dane, Grant, Green, Iowa, Jefferson, Lafayette or Rock

- Award recipient only will be contacted by April 22, 2019.
- Winner names will be shared with their high schools for possible announcement at school Award Ceremonies.

To Apply:

- Students must write an essay of up to 500 words on the assigned topic.
- Essays must be typed on plain white paper, double-spaced. The Money Smart Scholarship application must be attached to the essay.
- The essay must be the work of the student submitting the essay.
- The application form must be signed by the student and a parent/guardian.
